Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

PROPOPSED CAPITAL WORKS PROJECT at PPS - Competition level gymnasium and music centre

We are all very excited about the proposed capital works project announced in the State Budget for Pinewood Primary School. We now commence the official government process with the VSBA and the Department of Education to secure the works, beginning with the Asset Management Plan, Phase 1 (AMP 1).

The purpose of the AMP 1 is to enable the school community to define its organisation, culture, aspirations, and learning and teaching model so that the architect consultants can match future design to the aspirational educational requirements of the school AMP2.

We have been given the wonderful opportunity to create a new learning environment and are seeking community input to best meet the needs of all members of our school.

To seek the necessary community information for the completion of the AMP 1, we have created a short survey based around 3 questions, designed to facilitate the school community with an opportunity to provide their input.

As your community representatives, members of the current School Council have been assigned a randomly generated list of parent names to call personally, and request feedback using the 3 questions to form the parameters of the conversation.

School Council members will then provide a summary of feedback contributed by the community to inform and complete the AMP 1. The School Council will commence contacting several randomly selected school community members to seek a brief survey response from between Friday 1st June to Monday 19th June. The School Leadership Team will also be seeking student feedback via a focus group, and staff feedback via a google form.

PINEWOOD DRIVE - Notice of Road Resurfacing Works

Monash Council has supplied the school with a 'Notice of Road Resurfacing Works' that will be occurring in Pinewood Drive next week. The scheduled road works are planned for Monday 5th June until Wednesday 7thJune (inclusive), from 7am- 5pm each day.

Unfortunately, given the nature of the works, parents/carers will not be able to park vehicles in Pinewood Drive whilst the road works are occurring. This will impact parking opportunities for school drop off and pick up along Pinewood Drive on those specified days. Please seek alternative parking arrangements during these times. From Wednesday 7thJune onwards, line marking works will occur.




