LAST DAY TERM 2- Tomorrow

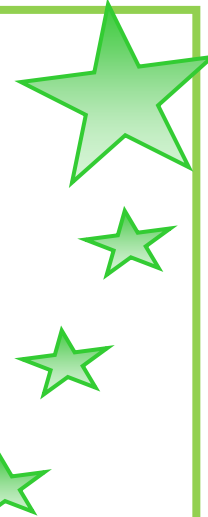

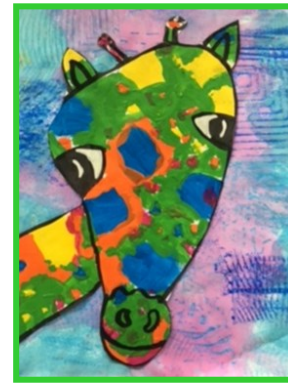
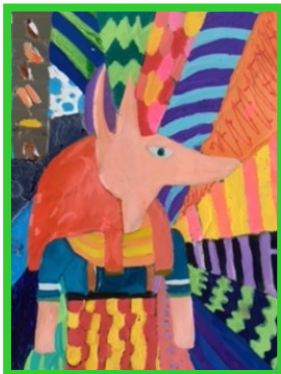

ART EXHIBITION

Pierre Bonnard is one of the most beloved painters of the 20th century, celebrated for his use of colour to convey an exquisite sense of emotion. His close friend Henri Matisse declared that Bonnard was 'a great painter, for today and definitely also for the future'.

PIERRE BONNARD

Pierre Bonnard (1867-1947) is celebrated as one of the great painters of the twentieth century. Emerging as an artist in Paris in the 1890s among a lively group of intellectuals and artists, Bonnard's early reputation was based on shrewdly observant illustrations and decorative paintings. In the twentieth century, Bonnard pursued painting as it suited his singular vision and in response to personal circumstance, including his move to the countryside with his lifelong companion, Marthe de Miligy. Together, they lived in Normandy and later in the south of France.

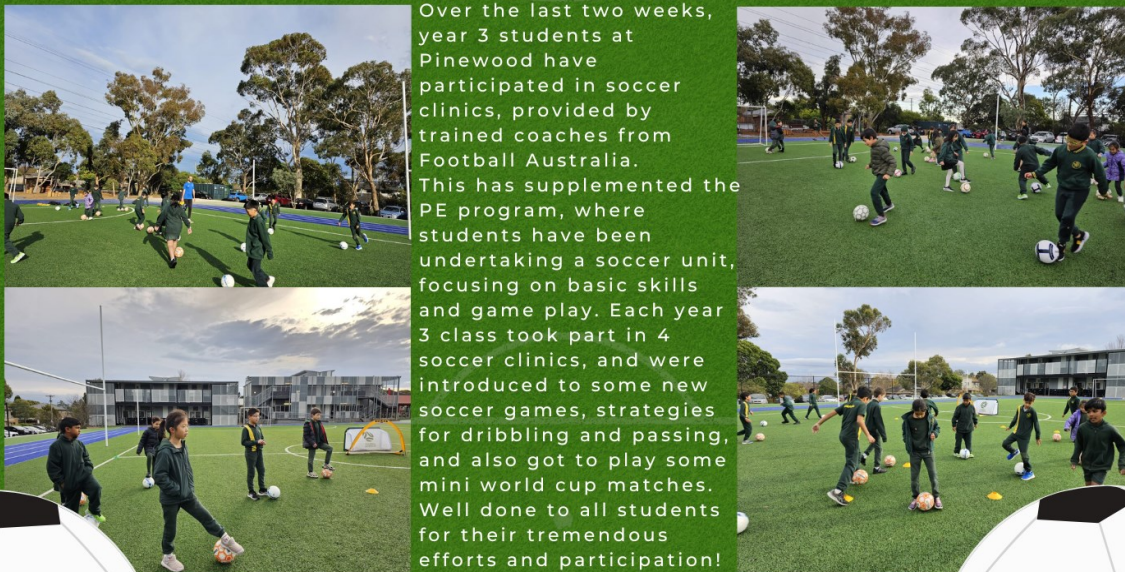


YEAR 6 SOCCER ROUND ROBIN

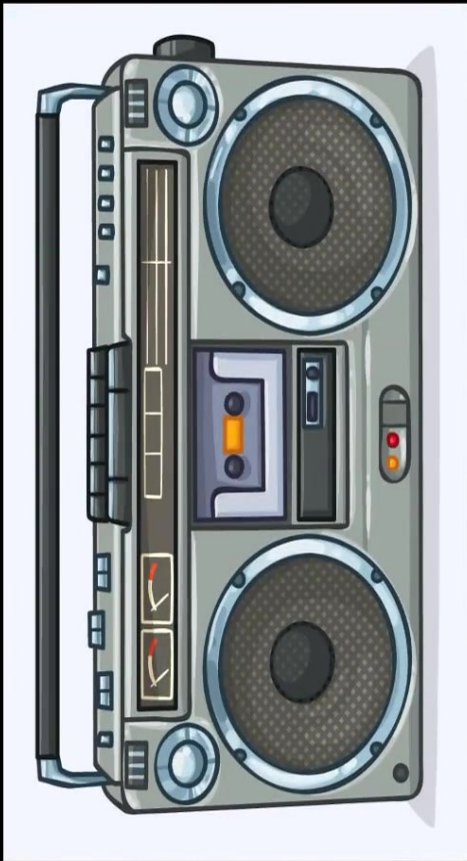
