



# **FLU FACT SHEET.**

In Victoria, influenza commonly known as the flu peaks during the winter months, however infections can occur throughout the year. Influenza is an acute respiratory illness.

# The common signs and symptoms are:

- Cough.
- Headache.
- Muscle aches and pain
- Fatigue.
- Runny nose.
- Sore throat.





Influenza can be spread by an infected person coughing, sneezing or through touching surfaces where an infected persons droplet has landed.

## **Preventative Measures**

We can all help to prevent the spread of influenza or an influenza like illness by washing our hands as required - (maintaining good hand hygiene).

Practising good cough etiquette. Cover your nose and mouth with a clean tissue. Put the used tissue in the bin. Wash hands immediately or use hand sanitiser.

If you do not have a clean tissue, cough or sneeze into the inside of your elbow.

Vaccination is also a tool used to prevent influenza and its complications. Please discuss this with your doctor to attain whether this is appropriate for you and your family.

Additional measures to prevent the spread of influenza can include:

- The use of a face mask.
- Do not attend school, childcare, or work if you or suspect you have influenza or an influenza like illness.
- Limit the use of or avoid public transport.
- Do not visit family or friends in high-risk settings such as residential care facilities or hospitals.


















We have an exciting opportunity for students in the Waverley area to participate in Softball Victoria's 2023 Junior Development Program.


