NAPLAN

Ahead of NAPLAN results being released from Monday 17 July, please be aware of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels. These are: exceeding, strong, developing and needs support.

GASTRO FACT SHEET

Gastroenteritis often called gastro is a common illness in children. Viruses are the most common cause of gastroenteritis. People and animals can carry the germs which cause gastroenteritis in their faeces. There are many kinds of viruses, so gastroenteritis can occur more than once. Bacteria and parasites can also cause gastroenteritis and are usually found in contaminated food or water.

The common symptoms are:

- Diarrhoea.
- Stomach cramps.
- Vomiting.
- Nausea.
- Fever
- Headache



How is Gastroenteritis spread?

Gastro occurs when the germs are taken in by the mouth. For example, from person to person. It may occur directly by close personal contact or indirectly touching contaminated surfaces — taps, toilet handles, children's toys, nappies etc. It can also be acquired from contaminated drinking water, airborne droplets of vomit, coughing or sneezing, handling pets and other animals.



Preventative Measures

By maintaining good hand hygiene, we can all help to prevent the spread of gastroenteritis. Wash hands thoroughly with soap and hot running water for at least ten seconds.

Some examples of when to wash hands are:

- Before eating.
- Before preparing and handling food.
- After going to the toilet or changing a child's nappy.
- After working in the garden.
- After playing with and feeding pets.

Other ways to avoid getting gastro are by maintaining safe food handling, keep all kitchen surfaces and equipment clean, and regularly clean the toilet and bathroom.

It is important to keep children away from school until there has not been a loose bowel motion for 48 hours.
