We completed the collection of feedback/input from our parent community, staff, and students around the guiding questions which were designed to inform the Capital Work's Project at PPS.





# Art Fun in the Sun!




Welcome back to another fabulous fun filled week in the art room!

Seen below are Grade 2L working so hard on their pointillism sunrises, whilst being out in the sunshine- what a treat! They look amazing!

























# STEM




