#### Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **LANDCARE DAY**

There was a pulpable 'buzz' around the school on Friday as students and staff enthusiastically participated in Landcare Day at PPS. Wheelbarrows, rakes, shovels, brooms, watering cans and gardening gloves were in abundance as students enthusiastically participated in 3 areas of Landcare: planting indigenous seedlings in garden beds and sustainability, water management, and waste management. Many thanks to the Monash Council Landcare coordinator who visited the school grounds to advise us of the names of plants that are indigenous to this area and to the Green Link Nursery, in Box Hill, for supplying 500 native seedlings (at a very cheap price), to plant around the school.

It was a wonderful day of student activity demonstrating genuine care for our school grounds.

Thanks again to Ms Pereira and Mr Wong (our STEM teachers) for the work you both did developing a whole school set of activities for teachers to use from Prep - Year 6, and for resourcing of materials to be used on the day to enable the successful implementation of our Landcare Program. Thanks also to Mr Thomas for assisting with the resourcing of materials for the program.

Hopefully, Landcare Day will become an annual feature of the school program at PPS.













#### MUSEUM EXCURSION

On Monday our Year 3 students went on an excursion to the Melbourne Museum...

#### 2023 PARENT/CAREGIVER/GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY

A random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents/caregivers/guardians has been selected to participate in this year's survey.

The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from **Monday 21st August to Friday 8th September 2023.** 

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

The survey results will be communicated to parents/caregivers/guardians through the annual reporting process. Last year we used the survey results to target specific areas in our Annual Implementation Plan.
















When: Tuesday 29th August from 11am (or anytime up to 5pm).
















#### 'Friday House Competitions!'
