### Principal's Message

#### Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **WELCOME BACK to Term 4**

Welcome back to school for Term 4. Time seems to be flying by very fast. Our prep students look more grown up every term and are really making huge progress in their learning, and our wonderful Year 6 students will be off to secondary school in just a few months.



We have many exciting activities and learning opportunities planned for our students this term, including several year level camps, (Year 5 and Year 3), and some fabulous excursions and incursions.

This twelve-week term is sure to be very busy with our leadership team and staff being involved in planning for the 2024 school year as well as delivering a high-quality curriculum and additional learning opportunities for our students.

Please note that Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November is a Curriculum Day (Assessment and Reporting) and Tuesday 7th November is a public holiday for the Melbourne Cup, thus our school will be closed on these two days. OSHClub will be open for bookings for Curriculum Day (Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November) should you require the service.

### THE SWIMMING PROGRAM

The Pinewood PS Swimming program commences this term for all classes with our Prep and Year 1 students commencing the swimming program next week.

This year's swimming program will again take place at SwimWorld. One of the advantages of conducting the swimming program at SwimWorld is that we have the venue to ourselves on the lesson days (the pool not being open to the public). The students participate in eight swimming lessons over two weeks.



Pinewood PS's priority is to provide a valuable, AUSTSWIM approved swimming program for our students, that includes water safety, confidence around water and stroke development. Swimming, and especially, water safety and survival, is an important part of our Health and Physical Education Program. I encourage all students to participate in the water safety program.

### **CAPITAL WORKS Project -AMP2 Meeting**

On Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> September, both Andrew Thomas (AP) and I attended an onsite meeting with the VSBA nominated Project Delivery Manager- Trevor Power, and 3 architects from the winning tender company (Centrum Architects), regarding the Capital Works Project at PPS - a commercial sized gymnasium and music centre.











We discussed roles and responsibilities, project milestones and approval points, master planning and schematic design. We were required to complete several tasks:

- Area Analysis/ Services/Planning
- Spatial Analysis Plan Components
- Program Dates -Timing.

I am sure this initial meeting will be the first of many meetings we will be attending during the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) led Capital Works Project and the AMP 2 process for PPS.

#### SMART HATS- for Term One and Term Four. NO HAT NO PLAY!

A reminder for this term, that all students are required to wear their broad brimmed hats for outdoor activities, this includes recess, lunch and Physical Education lessons. Students without hats will be required to refrain from play and stay in the shaded areas of the school - No Hat, No Play. Please ensure your child's hat is clearly labelled with their name, as names on hats assist with the returning of a hat to the correct owner, should the hat be found outside or misplaced.





Sunscreen is also available for our students; however, they are welcome to BYO and apply sunscreen at school. Students will be required to wear their hats from Monday 2nd October through until the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 2024 when involved in outdoor activities or outdoor recess.

#### **PREP ENROLMENTS for 2024**

As a result of the strong interest in PPS and our ongoing growth, the Department of Education have continued with enrolment restrictions on our school. In short, the school remains to be a school where enrolments are accepted for 2024 by living 'in zone' and/or making a sibling application.

We are currently finalising student enrolments for Prep 2024. If you are a parent at our school and have a younger sibling to enrol for next year, please download an enrolment form from the website and return it to the school, or see Katherine, Estelle, or Jan at our school office for an enrolment form as soon as you can.

#### **PLANNING FOR 2024**

We are at that time of the year where we are in the process of planning for 2024. We know that some families unfortunately won't be with us next year, due to moving to a new house or area etc. If that includes your family, we are sorry to see you leave our community. This supports us with our planning for next year. We thank you for your support and understanding.



### **CLASS PLACEMENT for 2024**

Over the next few weeks, we will be working on the 2024 class structure and, later in the term, student placement. The process is a complex one. Firstly, we identify our estimated enrolment and then look at the numbers in each year level to develop a class structure, thus the importance of timely information from parents.

Teachers work in their teams to develop preliminary class lists. They consider a number of factors when developing these lists; including academic ability, special skills and talents, social competencies, students who work well together and those who may not work well together. Skills needed for 'building new relationships' are an important part of our educative process, so please note that friendship groupings are considered only for unique needs.

Parent input, based strictly on student learning needs, is also considered.











Parents who have specific concerns about their child's unique learning needs for 2024 are invited to provide written information to Ms Jenkin (not the class teacher) by **4.00pm Friday 3rd November.** 

Please note that we are not able to consider information received after this date as once class lists are made up, they are extremely difficult, if not impossible, to change.

Parents occasionally place requests for teachers. Please be aware that this facility is **not available** for a number of reasons. For instance, teachers may leave the school, or they may be deployed to other year levels or roles in the school.

The ultimate responsibility for student and teacher allocations rests with the principal. Our school processes are most comprehensive and professional with decisions always made in the best interest of our students.

#### LATE STUDENT PICKUPS FROM SCHOOL

All students are dismissed from their classes at 3.30pm. Please notify the office if you are going to be late to pick up your child/children. It can be distressing for students if their parent/carers have not arrived to collect them, nor communicated with the office that they are running late to pick them up.
