# Spotlight on STEM



This term students have been introduced to block coding using Scratch Jr. They are experimenting with using drag-and-drop to create a simple sequence of steps (algorithm) to move their characters around a setting.





### Year 1

This term students are further exploring block coding using Lightbot and Osmo Coding Awbie. They are improving when writing a sequence of steps (algorithm) needed to solve simple problems.

#### Year 2

This term students are further exploring problem solving when block coding using SpriteBox and Osmo Coding Awbie. They are practicing designing algorithms to solve simple problems.





### Year 3

This term students are showcasing their understanding of programming Ozobots. They are using different colour codes when creating their own tracks to send their bot on an around-the-world adventure.

# THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

Thunderstorm asthma events typically occur from October when pollen is drawn into the atmosphere and dispersed through a storm.

Thunderstorm asthma is triggered by a mixture of grass, pollen in the air and thunderstorm conditions. It happens when pollen grains are drawn up into the clouds as a thunderstorm forms. The pollen grains absorb water, swell, and burst open.

Particles containing pollen allergens are released. The wind can push these tiny particles down to ground level where they can be breathed into the lungs.

Thunderstorm asthma usually affects people in the windy period before the rain starts. It usually happens in spring and early summer.

Simple things you can do to avoid thunderstorm asthma triggers include:

Check the forecast and pollen counts. The epidemic thunderstorm asthma risk forecast is published on the Vic emergency site/app.

INTEGRITY

- Visit your doctor and develop an asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan.
- Make sure you have your reliever medication with you.
- Stay inside, especially when it is windy before the rain.
- Close your doors and windows.
- If an air conditioner is on, set it to recirculate air.







