# **Update!**

Earlier this year we shared our son's story with you all regarding his Perthes Disease, and we thought

tit would be good to update the school community on his progress.



Harvey has slowly been allowed to increase his cardio and running and jumping over time, but as with all children we needed to ensure that it was at a pace he can understand. He has been so resilient throughout his disease and treatment that we are very proud of him. In August this year we had our regular paediatric surgeon check up with Dr Brian Loh. This was our first time to have a 6-month gap between appointments, which is always a good sign when they get further apart! We got amazing news at that check up that

Harvey was allowed to run and jump to his heart's content! He was not going to need his wheelchair for long distances anymore. Below is a snapshot of his femoral head, from left first diagnosis, to right the xray in August this year.

We are beyond thrilled with this news, but we know that there is still a journey to go until Harvey is a 🔻 🗸 completely back to normal health. Harvey has lost a lot of cardio strength and muscle wastage over the years whilst he goes through the stages of Perthes. So as a result, we will still have regular physio work need to help build up his muscle and hip strength and endurance of cardio so he can keep up with his peers. Sometimes you will still see him needing more rest than others, but we are just so happy to see him running with his friends. We can also see how much happier Harvey is with his new freedom!

We want to thank everyone who has reached out to ask how Harvey is going and shown their support.


