
This academic year, we are committed to creating a nurturing and inclusive environment that promotes not only academic excellence but also the holistic development of every child.

#### **COLC- CREATING OUR LEARNING COMMUNITY - 2024**

The first week of the school year has commenced very well, with students participating in the program, 'Creating Our Learning Community (COLC) for 2024'. The students are really enjoying the engaging activities planned for them by the year level teachers. The COLC program assists students with settling into their new classes, making new friends and the building of a great teaching, and learning environment.

This year, we have a focus on "Connecting to Country" fostering a deeper awareness of the land on which we work and play, and developing school pride. As such, students from Years 1- 6 have attended sessions with Murrundindi, the Ngurungaeta (Wurundjeri tribe Leader), as part of the COLC program, as well as a Welcome to Country ceremony at the start of the day.

The COLC inclusive program is designed to build on the Victorian Curriculum learning areas of Humanities, Civics and Citizenship, History, English, and the Arts, Critical and Creative Thinking, and Personal and Social Capabilities. The COLC program supports the implementation of the 'PERMA +' model, underpinning our 'whole school' approach to wellbeing at Pinewood PS.

**TEACHER COMMUNICATION TOOL - SEESAW** will continue to be the whole school communication tool for parent/ teacher communication. Seesaw will be used across all year levels. You will receive information from class teachers about this in the coming days.

#### **COMMUNICATION with PARENTS and CARERS**

Our school Newsletter is produced each Thursday and distributed to families electronically via Compass. It can be viewed on our website. Hard copies of the newsletter will be available from the school administration office. Compass is our major method of communication with parents. Please ensure that you check notifications and information via Compass regularly and you have your correct login details. Please contact our school office with any problems or concerns.

#### MEET and GREET Sessions - "Getting to know you"

To establish vital links between home and school, 'Meet and Greet' or 'Getting to Know You' sessions have been organised for Week 4, Term 1. These initial meetings will be scheduled for ten minutes, occurring on Tuesday 20th February between 3.45-7.30pm, Wednesday 21st February between 3.45-4:45 and Thursday 22nd February 3.45-4.45. Morning sessions will also be available with some staff.

The session will be an opportunity for you to meet your child's class teacher either 'virtually' or in person and to share information about your child. (The online meetings will be held through the Webex virtual meeting platform).

We ask that you login as close to your interview time as possible and exit once your interview/s conclude. You will be able to book your interview time/s with your child/rens' teacher/s using the Compass Parent Portal. Specialist teachers are also available for sessions on these days; however, their spaces are very limited as our Specialist teachers cover many classes.

Bookings for Meet and Greet sessions will open on Thursday, 8th February from 9.30am and will close at 4.00pm on Wednesday 14th February.

A parent communication message will be sent via Compass when the Meet and Greet Conferences open. If you have any issues booking an appointment, please contact the office between 9.00am and 4.00pm to assist you with this on 8847 3200. The teachers look forward to meeting all parents virtually during a

scheduled opportunity and finding

out more about your child.















#### **CURRICULUM INFORMATION EVENING**

We hold parent curriculum information sessions in Term 1 for each year level.

This year Curriculum Information sessions are scheduled for Tuesday 13th February (Grades 3 & 5) and Wednesday 28th February (Grades Prep-2, 4 & 6). Information sessions will be conducted via Webex. Each year level session will be recorded for parents to access later if unable to attend the initial session.



Parents will be informed of the time and Webex link via class Seesaw communication closer to the date.

#### **EXTREME WEATHER**

We have a comprehensive set of procedures in place for when the weather is very hot or extreme. Students are brought inside to the classrooms at recess and lunch times during periods of 'wild', wet, or very hot weather as we have air conditioning throughout our school. For example, whenever the weather is particularly hot (at 33 degrees) we hold a "hot day timetable" where the students stay inside in



air-conditioned comfort during lunchtime. We also encourage all students to drink water and to have a plastic, not glass, water bottle with them in class. Our school has invested in, and maintains, air conditioners in every classroom and other areas, including the specialist rooms, library, FLS areas and the Hall.



Please remember that school broad brimmed or legionnaire's hats need to be worn when students are playing outside and during PE classes when conducted outside. The use of sunscreen is encouraged. <u>Uniform Policy</u>

It is important to pack foods in lunchboxes that will not 'go off' in hot weather. We recommend that children do not bring cold meats and cheese on very hot days — even food in a lunch box that includes an ice pack can deteriorate quickly and become unsafe to eat.

Fresh fruit is always a good choice as students are permitted to snack on fruit and vegetables during class times or at 10.00am for short 'brain food' breaks.


# Medication Reminder.



If your child requires medication at school. Please fill out a medication authorisation form these are available from the school office.

The medication must be in the original container with the original label and within its expiry date.

Please hand all medication to the school nurse or if unavailable to the office staff.















#### Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or:
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund. (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

#### Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

#### Payment amounts

#### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.


#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
  - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
  - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

If you have PREVIOUSLY applied for CSEF, THERE IS NO NEED for you TO COMPLETE A NEW FORM FOR 2024, UNLESS YOU HAVE ADDITIONAL STUDENT/S NOW AT THE SCHOOL. YOUR CURRENT CENTRELINK CARD will be verified. CSEF forms are now available from the school office. Please provide a copy of your eligibility card with your completed form by the end of Term 2, Friday 28th June 2024



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


