NAPLAN 2024

This year's NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy) is to be conducted in Term 1. This is a nationwide scheduling decision, independent of Pinewood Primary School's organisational structures. The formal test window for NAPLAN 2024 will be 13th - 25th March.

Parents should note that catch up opportunities for the writing test can only be scheduled for students in Year 3, in the case of student absences. Catch up writing tests are only allowable in Year 5 if there is a disruption to the test due to technological issues.

NAPLAN tests are conducted online for all subjects, except for Writing in Year 3, which is conducted on paper.

We encourage all students to participate in NAPLAN, however there are circumstances where families may wish to withdraw their child from taking part. Testing adjustments are available for our students with formal diagnoses, or who usually receive significant classroom adjustments; further information will be sent to all families in Year 3 and Year 5 next week regarding this.

YEAR ONE ENGLISH ONLINE ASSESSMENTS (EOL)

The Department of Education have made the decision that all Year One students in Victoria will have their literacy skills assessed through the English Online Interview (EOI) during Term 1. This is a requirement for Year One government school students and is aimed to support them in learning to read by providing teachers with some targeted assessment data.

We have initially planned for each Year One teacher to be released for 2 testing days and will evaluate whether we need to provide more days to assess all our students, after the initial testing days have completed.

On the following days, your child's classroom teacher will be replaced by a Casual Release Teacher (CRT) to enable them to work one-on-one with each student to conduct the English Online Assessments:

1B: Tuesday 13th February & Friday 1st March

1G: Friday 16th February & Friday 23rd February

1H: Tuesday 20th February & Friday 1st March

1L: Tuesday 20st February & Tuesday 27th February

1S: Tuesday 13th February & Friday 1st March

1T: Friday 16th February & Tuesday 27th February

YEAR TWO ENGLISH ONLINE ASSESSMENTS (EOL)

Although not mandated by the Department of Education, Year Two teachers have also been initially released for two testing days (EOL).

2024 PARENT CONTRIBUTIONS

IT'S NOT GREAT TO BE LATE

Students need to arrive promptly at school, ready to engage and learn. Please note that children need to be at school and in their classrooms, ready to learn, by 9.00 am each school day. For families where both parents may work and therefore need to drop off their children before 8:45 am, the school provides an Out of School Hours Care program managed by OSHClub. Registration is via their website.



REMINDER - STUDENT ACCIDENT AND PRIVATE PROPERTY INSURANCE

Reminder: The Department of Education and Training (DET), and government schools, do not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and carers are generally responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Reasonable low-cost accident insurance policies are available from the commercial insurance sector. The Department of Education also does not hold insurance, nor does it accept responsibility for private property brought to school by students, staff and visitors. Students are advised not to bring any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school and are not allowed to bring any electronic toys and games to school. Please ensure that you have Ambulance cover as this is not covered by the school or the Department.

DRIVING and PARKING AROUND OUR SCHOOL

Parents are reminded to drive with the extreme care and caution around the school. Last week, several parents were contacted by authorities for making a U turn on the Pinewood Drive School crossing itself - this is a very dangerous driving practice and potentially compromises the safety of children.

I have also had concerns raised by other parents about some drivers doing U turns near the Toombah Street crossing and the Staff Carpark entrance. This again is a dangerous driving practice as it potentially compromises the safety of our students.

The laneway between the school and Pinewood shopping centre, is also a very busy thoroughfare for students and parents at the beginning and end of each school day.

The laneway is privately owned land and is not part of the school. The laneway is not designed to carry the volume of school traffic that it does, therefore, extra care and patience is required for any drivers using this area.













SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

School Council elections are held at the beginning of each school year and the process must be completed by the end of March.

School Council has three main responsibilities. They are:

- 1. Finance overseeing the development of the school's annual budget and ensuring proper records are kept of the school's financial arrangements
- 2. Strategic Planning participating in the development and monitoring of the school's Strategic Plan
- 3. Policy Development and Review developing, reviewing, and updating policies that reflect a school's values and supports the school's broad direction outlined in the Strategic Plan.

Other key functions of School Council include:

- Raising funds for school related purposes
- Maintaining school grounds and facilities
- Reporting annually to the school community and the Department
- · Representing and taking the views of the community into account
- Regulating and facilitating after-hours use of school premises and grounds
- Operating Out of School Hours Care

Currently, School Council meets on the third Tuesday of each month; however, days and times are confirmed at the first meeting of a newly elected School Council.

Pinewood Primary School has a School Council of twelve members - eight parent members and four DE members.

If the number of nominations is equal to, or less than the number of vacancies then there will be no ballot.

School Council, Information and Responsibilities

School Council assists in the governance of the school with responsibilities to approve student camps and overnight excursions and student overseas travel; approve the annual budget; develop, review and update school policies in line with Department of Education guidelines and legislation; raise funds for the school; oversee the school grounds and building maintenance and oversee the strategic plan development and implementation.

They:

- assist in the efficient governance of the school
- ensure that its decisions affecting students at the school are made having regard, as a primary consideration, to the best interest of the students
- enhance the educational opportunities of students at the school
- ensure the school and the council complies with any requirements of this Act, the regulations, a Ministerial Order or a direction, guideline or policy issued under this Act.











I must emphasise that it is NOT the role of School Council and parent members of School Council to involve themselves in any concerns and complaints that parents may have regarding staff, other students or parents and the school. Please see the school Principal Class Leadership and/or your child's teacher if you have a concern, question, or complaint. We are very approachable and keen to alleviate concerns and resolve problems. School Council is not involved in any school operational and management matters or day-to-day running of the school.

Information about School Council

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.



Who is on the school council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education (DE) employees can be Parent members at their child's school. A mandated elected DE employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional Community member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests, or experiences. DE employees are not eligible to be Community members.

The term of office for all members is two years. Half the members must retire each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

How can you become involved?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might seriously consider:

standing for election as a member of the school council encouraging another person to stand for election.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All School Council elections must be completed by the end of March.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the parent category.

Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the School Council where their child is enrolled.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on Council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

- ⇒ Be sure to vote in the elections

Please note that School Councillors are expected to commit to attending all Council meetings each year, excepting unforeseen work or family events. Meetings are held twice each term on a Tuesday evening, usually the third Tuesday in the month, from 7.00pm.

Without the required quorum at Council meetings, we cannot complete our compliance demands relating to educational and financial policy and operations work at the school.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder. OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (<u>CSEF</u>): <u>Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: Camps, <a href="Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form



- Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

If you have PREVIOUSLY applied for CSEF, THERE IS <u>NO NEED</u> for you TO COMPLETE A NEW FORM FOR 2024, <u>UNLESS</u> YOU HAVE <u>ADDITIONAL STUDENT/S</u> NOW AT THE SCHOOL. YOUR CURRENT CENTRELINK CARD will be verified. CSEF forms are now available from the school office. Please provide a copy of your eligibility card with your completed form by the end of Term 2, Friday 28th June 2024

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
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
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
